The programme has been running for 3 years in the North East and recently secured funding for supplying heritage skills training in Cumbria.

We have courses for enthusiastic homeowners, professionals wishing to understand practical skills for specifying and for CPD purposes, students wishing to provide evidence towards qualifications and craftspeople looking to diversify and improve their skills. All courses and events are recognised by the IHBC as providing the CPD requirements of a full member, and the training courses may provide evidence towards the NVQ 3 in Heritage Skills and CSCS heritage cards.

Funding for the post has been provided by the Northern Rock Foundation and the project is part funded by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development: Europe investing in rural areas. The Heritage Skills Initiative works closely with the North West Heritage Skills Coordinator who is steered by a group of built heritage professionals with knowledge and influence at strategic level in national & regional organisations.
